PROFILE

Europe is facing a rapid development these days. Over the past twenty years the map of Europe has changed. The main division constituted by the Cold War has disappeared. Although new conflicts have arisen and the formation of new nation-states has drawn new borders, today Europe is characterised by a comprehensive co-operation across the borders. It takes place at many levels, from national to regional and local, including cross-border regional cooperation.

With the study programme in European Studies, which focuses upon regional development, you will have the opportunity of analysing and understanding the developments in Europe – including the regions of Europe. Consequently, you will get qualifications to take part in the process of shaping Europe in the future through work in development-oriented projects run by enterprises, legal authorities, and European institutions.

The programme is international and appeals to students from all over Europe and abroad. All classes will be taught in English and all study material will be in English. To ensure a uniform level, language-wise, a workshop in English is offered during the first semester.

The bachelor programme builds upon basic subjects within social sciences and business administration, supplemented with basic

knowledge in innovation and intercultural communication. The distinctive character of the programme is reflected in the choice of subjects that give insight into European issues, regional problems, and project development.

The programme is organized so that you will obtain a theoretical understanding, factual knowledge and analytical abilities within the subjects that constitute the three main dimensions of the programme: Europe, Regions, and Development.

During the programme you will be offered excellent opportunities for studying abroad, either by spending a semester at a foreign university or completing an internship.

A Bachelor degree gives access to study for a Master degree. A natural choice would be to continue with the Master programme in European Studies. Nevertheless, it will also be possible to follow for example the Master programmes in IT, communication and organisation, or IT product development. The Bachelor degree alone may also lead to employment.

The programme in European Studies has been created in a cooperation between the University of Southern Denmark and the University of Flensburg. It has been established as an Interreg IIIA programme funded by the

European Union. The three-year Bachelor programme is offered at the University of Southern Denmark in Sønderborg.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

Entrance requirements are an upper secondary school leaving examination with English and Mathematics corresponding with the Danish level B and C.

For *Non-EU/EEA* citizens from countries where English is not the native language adequate proficiency in spoken and written English is required since English is the language of instruction. One of the following proficiency tests is required: TOEFL with a score of min. 575 paper based, computer based min. 230, or IELTS with a score of min. 6.5. PLEASE NOTE: The University of Southern Denmark has access to the IELTS Verification Service; therefore we accept the IELTS test results/score in copy. TOEFL is only

accepted in original sent directly from the test centre or the educational testing service (ETS) before registration deadline.

EU/EEA citizens and Exchange students are required to document English skills corresponding with English at B level as required by the Danish students.
